Community Food Pantry cuts schedule to three days a week

The following changes have been made at the Community Food Pantry due to the Coronavirus to reduce the exposure of their volunteers to this virus, and to ensure that they have food available to supply their visitors. Many need help, now more than ever.

The Food Pantry will be open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9 a.m. to noon.

Rather than providing three meals for three days, they will provide three meals for two days.

They will allow only two visitors at a time into the lobby to ensure social distancing. Others are to wait outside.

They are hoping to remain open.

I completed basic training, clerical/administrative school and six weeks training in the Military Police. I was assigned to US Army Headquarters, Governor's Island, New York City. My work was with the Criminal Investigation Division (CID) stationed at 346 Broadway, New York City. I was lodged at Staten Island and would ride the Staten Island Ferry at the same time cars were allowed.

I received my Honorable Discharge in October 1965 and returned home to Portsmouth to be with my parents. I worked as a secretary for a large construction company. I met and married Jimmy Steele as he was stationed at Pease Air Force Base in N.H. Unfortunately, after 52 years of marriage, my husband, Jimmy passed away January 2019. We were blessed with two beautiful children, a boy and a girl. Additionally, we have been blessed with four beautiful grandchildren, two boys and two girls.

I attend chair exercises at the Senior Center and volunteer at the Military Welcome Center for the Bay County Veteran's Council. I am a member of St Bernadette's Catholic Church. I mean everything - mail, bank accounts, land, taxes, insurances. I am "free" of stress.
