"Foundations of the Club"

The April edition of The Civic Courier, "Foundations of the Club" is highlighting Rowan Quave and focusing on one of our supported organizations, J.R. Arnold High School Culinary and Hospitality Programs.



Rowan Quave

Rowan Quave was born and raised in Greenwood, Mississippi. She moved to the Mississippi Gulf Coast in 1957 when she married Jerry, her husband of 65 years. They lived in Biloxi and then moved to Ocean Springs in 1969. After losing their home and possessions in Hurricane Katrina in 2005, they moved to Panama City Beach. They chose Panama City Beach because their son Jay and their three grandchildren Oliva, Molly and Douglas lived here. They enjoyed being close to them and to be able to participate in their activities.

Rowan met Nan VandenBerg through her daughter-in-law and over lunch, Nan told her all about the Women's Civic Club and everything they did. Rowan wanted to join the club to meet new people and to see how she could contribute. She was installed in December 2007. She also really likes Nan and has remained friends ever since their first lunch.

Rowan is not a stranger to volunteering. She oversaw a food pantry in Ocean Springs for several years and wanted to do much more in Panama City Beach. As part of the Fashion Show Committee, she has participated in the planning and modeled for Fashion Show. Rowan has also served on the Silent Auction and Dance Committee working many of the events. Unfortunately, several years after joining the club, she had a stroke which limited her ability to do as much as she wanted to. When three years later she had another stroke, it kept her from participating in many of the club events. Although she feels guilty at not being able to serve in a greater capacity, she continues to attend meetings, solicit donations for the silent auction, stuffs bags for Ironman and attends and supports the club's fundraisers. Her daughter Julie Sanders, who retired and moved here in 2011, ensures that Rowan gets to each meeting and many of the events. After Julie became a member in March 2020, they were able to serve together on the silent auction, arts and crafts and lunches and programs committees and most recently started going to Bunco which she enjoys.

The best memories Rowan has of the club are all the wonderful people she has had the opportunity to meet and work with as we contribute to so many worthwhile groups on the beach. She also enjoys sharing the time with her daughter Julie.

J.R. Arnold High School Culinary and Hospitality Programs



J.R. Arnold High School serves the Panama City Beach community as a comprehensive high school for students in grades 9-12. In addition to providing students with rigorous academic classes leading to college credit, our Marlins also have the opportunity to take advantage of Career Technical Education, CTE, courses and acquire industry certifications from the National Restaurant Association.

The National Restaurant Association ServSafe Food Protection Manager Certification is nationally recognized. Earning the certification tells the industry that they know food safety and the critical importance of its role—and enables the student to share food safety knowledge with every other employee.

Through ServSafe Food Safety Program, they will master sanitation, the flow of food through an operation, sanitary facilities, and pest management. ServSafe is the training that is learned, remembered, shared, and used.

The Culinary and Hospitality programs at J.R. Arnold High School serve as a direct career link for students interested in some of our community's most important commercial industries. These programs are designed to be completed in four years, but all students must take and pass the ServSafe exam during their first year in the program. The ServSafe exam is the food industry's test to make certain people preparing and serving food can do so in a safe and healthy manner, so the public is protected from foodborne illnesses.

The Culinary and Hospitality programs are led by Chef Billy Redd. Under his leadership, J.R. Arnold's Culinary and Hospitality programs have been award-winning during local competitions, and they were asked to cater the Bay District School's Employee Recognition program. Graduates of Arnold's Culinary and Hospitality programs are sought after by

area businesses proving these Marlins have the knowledge, skills, and ability to continue providing visitors to the Emerald Coast fine dining experiences and superior hospitality. The students of J.R. Arnold High School Culinary Program are employed all over the panhandle of Florida.

During their four-year education they receive training in professional knife skills, cooking principles, baking and pastry, soups and sauces, fruit and vegetable carving just to name a few. The education they receive at J.R. Arnold High School prepares the student for a successful career in the Culinary and Hospitality industry. The students are also prepared to enter the post-secondary Programs to continue their education at colleges from Keiser University in Tallahassee to Pensacola State College in Pensacola, Florida. Our goal is to prepare the student for employment straight out of high school or to continue their education at a school of their choice. All in all, a student of J.R. Arnold High School Culinary is prepared for success in life!

Food Pantry

First let me thank those members of the Women's Civic Club who are volunteers for the Food Pantry. They like us, depend on volunteers to fulfill their commitment to the community. Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church has another similarity to our organization; they only serve those who live on Panama City Beach.

In January and February, the pantry served 448 clients which equals 4,032 meals. Besides supporting the pantry with volunteers, we also collect food and money for the pantry at four of our monthly business meetings. At the February meeting our club members donated \$83. That, combined with the collection of cash received at our other meetings this year totals \$571 that our Club has donated to the pantry in addition to our annual grant made at the December luncheon.
