

### SAUSAGE / EGG BREAKFAST CASSEROLE

- 1 lb sausage
- 1 package crescent sheet
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 5 eggs
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 tsp Italian seasoning
- 1/2 tsp salt

Brown sausage in a skillet over medium heat, breaking it up as it cooks. Unroll crescent sheet and spread onto the bottom of a greased 9×13 pan.

Evenly spread sausage over the dough. (Crispy bacon or diced ham may also be used.)

Sprinkle cheese on top. In a bowl, whisk eggs, milk, Italian seasoning, salt and pepper. Pour over the top of your casserole. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes until eggs are set and crust is golden.
