"Foundations of the Club"

The February edition of The Civic Courier, "Foundations of the Club" is highlighting Jane Nendick and focusing on one of our charities, McElvey House -Anchorage Children's Home.



Jane Nendick

Jane Nendick is a native of Chattanooga, Tennessee and attended the University Tennessee where she received a bachelor's degree in education with a minor in child psychology and a master's degree administration and supervision. She completed the requirements, except for a published paper, for her PhD. Moving to Athens, Georgia she taught the 5th and 6th grades and was the child psychologist on staff.

Later she moved to Memphis, Tennessee where she lived for 34 years and taught at St. Mary's and later became the child psychologist at Lausanne School.

Along with her UT sorority sisters, Jane would come to Panama City Beach for spring break. She remembers when Back Beach Road was 2 lanes paved with oyster shells. Later as she was looking towards her future and retirement, she bought a condo in Panama City Beach.

She was invited to a Women's Civic Club Luncheon in 1998 by Mary Lynn Weaver. When Jane found out the club was involved in Paws and Claws, she knew she wanted to be a member and said "count me in." She was on a committee, chaired by Lorraine Odom, which started the Member to Member Committee. A highlight of their committee was a barter trade, where if one member needed a floral design, a cake, or other service, the member would go to another member with the talent. The member that fulfilled the service would get a club credit which they could use to fulfil their need at a later date. Jane being a member of the garden club and exceled in floral design so she was able to contribute to that area.

When asked what her favorite volunteering memory was, Jane said when she oversaw the Thunder Beach breakfast fundraiser. With no budget, she was able to get all the food, the supplies, the VFW venue and the chef at "no cost". Asking a \$5 donation for each ticket, she recalls the club made about \$6,000, so much that the VFW decided they would do it the following year.

Her wisdom for the club, is to take care of God's creation including the environment and humanity. She also said that the club has many beautiful women who touch your heart in some way.

McElvey House - Anchorage Children's Home

In 1983, McElvey Home, the vision of a local haven for hard to place teens who had suffered abuse or severe neglect, became a reality as the result of the tireless and compassionate efforts of a small group of concerned citizens. Anchorage Children's Home was born to meet a critical need of those no one else would serve. In 1985, the vision expanded to include homeless youth who run away, were thrown out, or at risk due to their family life. This culture of compassion and community partnership continues in Anchorage's services today.

McElvey House, in Panama City Beach, has undergone several changes since becoming one of the first residence programs in Bay County. In 2021, the house went from being a siblings' home to an at risk group home. Housing is provided for up to 8 youth, ages 12-17, who are currently in foster care and are at risk of human trafficking. The house provides a safe home like environment for the teen, allows them to attend school and to participate in extracurricular activities. The environment helps bring positive changes in their lives, helps them grow and succeed.

The Women's Civic Club has been supporting Anchorage Children's Home - McElvey House for several years through monetary donations, requested items collected at luncheon meetings or bought by the club and meal sharing.

Food Pantry

The food pantry continues to see a rise in number of people utilizing the pantry along with a rise in new clients who previously have never needed the assistance of a food pantry. In November and December 2022, the total number of people served was 467 and that equates to giving food and supplies out for 4,203 meals. In December, the pantry was opened for 12 days and the average number of meals given out per day was 184, the highest number for 2022.

Our Club along with many other groups, churches and organizations have fortunately donated food or monetary support for the food pantry to allow it to be open Monday, Wednesday and Friday's from 9- noon. The clients can utilize the pantry once a week. At the February monthly meeting/luncheon we will be collecting food/money for the pantry. Please continue to lend your support. The pantry serves only those residing in Panama City Beach and I am always proud to say our Club is a great supporter!
