# January Luncheon - An Inspiring Presentation by Dr. Milinda Stephenson, PhD



At our recent luncheon, author Dr. Milinda Stephenson, PhD, captivated attendees with her inspiring presentation. She shared the deeply personal and trans-formative journey that led her to discover the heroic life of her great-grandmother, Minnie Clara Brock—a woman who overcame incredible hardships to triumph against the odds.

Dr. Stephenson recounted a family Thanksgiving that sparked her quest for truth. A whispered revelation about a family secret—the suicide of her great-grandmother—set her on a path to uncover her family's untold stories. Although she never confirmed the details of that particular tragedy, her search unearthed the remarkable story of Minnie Clara, a courageous woman who became the heroine of her novel.

Born in Germany and immigrating to America in 1882, Minnie Clara's family struggled to adapt to life in Chipley, Florida. When her father, a former aristocrat and poet, refused manual labor, Minnie Clara, at just nine years old, took charge. Through farming, sewing, and sheer determination, she transformed her family's fortune. Following the death of her mother and the disappearance of her father, Minnie Clara took on the responsibility of raising her siblings.

Dr. Stephenson encouraged the audience to uncover and share the stories of the heroic women in their own families. She emphasized that these stories are vital for preserving history, inspiring future generations, and fostering resilience. Her interactive session prompted attendees to reflect on the storytellers and tales within their own families, sparking a creative journey to document and celebrate the lives of extraordinary women.

The presentation concluded with a heartfelt invitation: write your story, honor your family's legacy, and let the courage of past generations shine through to inspire the future. Unearth the stories from your own "Family Ghosts."
