# "Foundations of the Club"

The January edition of The Civic Courier, "Foundations of the Club" is highlighting Elaine Lichtenberger and focusing on one of our charities, Beach Care Services.



Elaine and Ron Lichtenberger moved to Panama City Beach from Northeast Ohio in 1994 when they transferred for their jobs. Elaine was an Account Manager for McKesson Corp (formerly General Medical Corp) where she covered hospitals from Tallahassee to Mobile and Southeast Alabama. Her career lasted 35 years with the company although same the company's name changed several times. In 1975 Elaine was one of the first females to become a medical supply sales rep.

After retiring from McKesson Elaine became a Realtor with Coldwell Banker Carroll Realty where she became close friends with Cherry Creekmore who sponsored her for membership in March 2008. She served as Recording Secretary, 1st Vice President and President. Elaine also chaired several committees and projects including Biker's Beach Breakfast, Tour of Homes, Silent Auction and Craft Sale. Nan VandenBerg was her mentor throughout the years and without Nan's guidance Elaine says she would never have accomplished much.

Some of the most fun times she had were at a couple of discontinued events, Tour of Homes and Biker's Beach Breakfast. Also, two of the Silent Auctions were held at the Edgewater Conference Center where there was entertainment and a fancy sit-down dinner. The Dance was a separate event in those days. Julie Bailey was a wonderful co-chair. Times change and she has lovely memories.

Elaine encourages everyone to sign-up to chair or co-chair a committee. You become a Board member and really get to know your WCC sisters and how things work.

Although she lives most of the year in Ohio, she remains a member and loves to see all the wonderful things the Club is doing.

## **Beach Care Services**

Founded in 1999, Beach Care Services is a very active local 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization that has helped thousands of Panama City Beach residents pay bills, afford their prescriptions, and buy gas or trolley passes to get to work. In any given year, BCS provides assistance to between 700-900 individuals and families in great need. Their mission is to provide short term emergency assistance to people who live or work on Panama City Beach and when they require long term or specialized assistance refer them to other social service agencies.

Beach Care Services is funded completely by contributions from local churches, businesses, individuals, and civic groups. They also host three signature events; Dinner on the Bay, Duck Races and Golf Tournament; each year to boost the funds needed to care for as many locals as possible.
