

Alice Jacobs, a member of our club since 2005, was born in 1934 near Indianapolis. She graduated from Carmel High School which at the time housed all grade levels in one building. At the age of 21, she married "Charlie" and they had four children. After her last child entered the first grade, she started her career working for Alcoa and was an employee for 26.5 years. Alice is quick to point out even when the children were home, she was "working". In addition to caring for her children, she cared for other children in her home, made and sold candles or other craft items, always keeping active.

When Alice started at Alcoa, she was the only employee in the one room office. She was transferred several times to different locations and various departments. At each location her responsibilities included establishing procedures, training and supervising employees. She loved traveling to the Alcoa plants throughout the country. At the age of 61, she retired from a full career with Alcoa. After her retirement, and having vacationed several times in Panama City Beach, they decided to move here.

Always wanting to stay active and at the age of 70, Alice answered an ad at Janet Roan's Real Estate Office, working parttime on weekends. Janet introduced her to the Women's Club. During her "active" time with the club she was involved in everything the club did. She remembers volunteering for Iron Man, Kitchen and Dance Committees.

As the First Vice President, when Nan Vandenberg was President, she was "Membership Chairman" and computerize the membership list. Alice's fondest memories with the club events are dancing with her husband at the Women's Civic Club dances.

When asked if she had any "words of wisdom" to share with the club members, she quickly responded: "Be active, attend meetings, form new friendships and most of all, even when you get older, stay active."

Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee selects a nominee for each office and verifies that the nominee is willing to serve. Each January, the members at the general meeting have the opportunity to submit a person's name who they wish to nominate to the Nominating Committee. All members are eligible for the committee. Once all the nominations are collected, the President will draw a nomination, announce the name on the form and give the member nominated an opportunity to decline or accept. The drawing continues until seven members have agreed to serve. The President officially appoints those seven members as the Nominating Committee.

The Committee selects a chair and hold meetings as deem necessary. At the February general meeting the Nominating Committee chair will present their slate of officers to the membership. The Committee is a one-time function and is dismissed after performance of their initial duty.

At the March general meeting, the presiding officer will reread the slate of officers selected by the Committee and call for additional nominations from the floor. All members, including the dismissed members of the Nominating Committee, are eligible to be nominated as a candidate. Voting is held at the April general meeting.
