Listed below is a description of the Volunteer Opportunities for Ironman. Please reply to Joyce at goetzjoyce@gmail with your volunteer task choices and your T-shirt size. This event is being held at the Edgewater Beach Resort Conference Center.

Packet and Bag Stuffing: Wednesday, May 8th 9:AM—2:00PM

Athlete packets will be prepared for the Check-in on Thur/Fri and the bags will be stuffed with the inserts, etc.. Each athlete will receive a packet that contains all of their materials needed for race day. The contents of each packet will have the athlete's corresponding bib number merged onto each item.

Athlete Check-In: Thursday, May 9th 1:00 PM—7:00PM; Friday, May 10th 8:30 AM—1:00 PM; and Friday, May 10th 1:00—5:30 PM

Athlete Check-in at each IRONMAN event is a critical part of the race experience Check-in is where athletes pick up all of the necessary paperwork and race articles necessary to compete in that specific IRONMAN event.
