"February Luncheon with Corporal Amy Burnette"



We were honored to host a thought-provoking luncheon February 1, where we gathered at The Wharf to raise awareness about two pressing issues: human trafficking and domestic violence. Corporal Amy Burnette with criminal division of the Bay County Sheriff's office shared valuable insights and firsthand experiences, shedding light on these critical topics.

Throughout Cpl. Burnette's presentation, she provided a detailed depiction of the challenges victims encounter, citing local and nearby instances that truly opened our eyes to the issues. One of the most impactful moments of the luncheon was when Cpl. Burnette shared personal stories of resilience and hope from survivors. These stories not only underscored the strength of the human spirit but also emphasized the urgent need for support and resources to empower survivors on their journey to healing and recovery. Cpl. Burnette says that it is important for the community to learn the signs of domestic and dating violence. "Domestic violence awareness is very key, because it happens behind closed doors," Characteristics you can look for include abuser isolating the victim from their friends and family, cutting off communication and other controlling behaviors. "It is important to look for signs of domestic violence, so you can potentially help somebody get out of that situation, and you yourself could actually help stop a homicide."We also learned that human traffickers often target people who are going through a challenging time or who lack a strong support system.

Cpl. Burnette has a lot of great mentors in her life including her great grandmother, Monica Henderson. Mrs. Henderson was a number one welder in WWII at the local shipyard when it was in downtown Panama City. She did this job and took care of a household, so that gives us an idea of where Cpl. Burnette might get some of her grit.


On Cpl. Burnette's Facebook page, there is a message to women considering going into law enforcement. She says "they need to be the boss of themselves. Love themselves, love God, and love family. "Know they are a force to be reckoned with, and know they are nothing but the best." Great advice from a great and brave woman who has "been there and done that."

As we consider the knowledge acquired, I encourage us to learn the signs of domestic violence and human trafficking and rekindle our commitment to fostering a safer community and actively work towards ending these violent crimes.


My name is Michelle Coombs. Originally from northern Ohio, we have lived across the state, as well as Indiana, New Jersey, Massachusetts and California.

To each participant, the results that flow from your efforts will make a difference in our community and we want to thank you for you unwavering commitment to our shared objectives.





At the April business luncheon, we will be collecting for the Panama City Beach Library.






