A Message from the Treasurers

As we are nearing the end of another fiscal year, we find ourselves in the most fortunate position of having additional funds to distribute. We are most appreciative of our fundraising partners, The St. Joe Community Foundation, Visit Panama City Beach, Todd and Angel Herendeen, Friends of Camp Helen, Ironman and Goldring Gulf Distributing, all of which generously provide opportunities for our fundraising.

While we enjoy tremendous support from our great Panama City Beach community, these fundraising efforts are made possible by our amazing members! You are the ones who repeatedly (yes, repeatedly!) answer the calls for help from your Committee Chairs. Our fundraising committees have had a successful year and should be proud of their accomplishments: Arts & Crafts, Dance, Ironman, Silent Auction and Special Beach Events.

At the April luncheon our members voted to provide an additional \$21,000 in funding to a variety of recipients: Girls, Inc., Anchorage Children's Home McElvey House, Salvation Army Domestic Violence, Boys & Girls Club, three local food pantries (Gulf Beach Baptist Church, Woodlawn Church, Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church), the five beach elementary schools (Breakfast Point Academy, Hutchison Beach Elementary, Patronis Elementary, Walsingham Academy and West Bay Elementary) and an additional two scholarships to Arnold High School seniors.

These funds added to the previously distributed funds (including the donation to the new Splash Pool at Frank Brown Park) just give proof that we are committed: United for a Better Community.

Scholarship

At the beginning of the year, we budgeted for two \$2,000 scholarships to be awarded to Arnold High School (AHS) graduating students. Because of additional money through fundraising activities this year, the members voted to award two additional scholarships.

Eleven very qualified candidates applied, 8 girls and 3 boys. Seven of the eleven applicants are in the top 10 % and 4 of those are in the top 5 % of a class of 340 graduating students. The 11th class ranked applicant is in the top 30 %. Several of the applicants are student athletes. Everyone is a leader and many serve as an Officer in academic or community organizations. Two of the boys are Eagle Scouts and two applicants have formed their own nonprofits that relate to helping teenagers. Wow.

Our President, Diane Vitale, and I reviewed the applications separately and then met to select the 4 recipients of our scholarships. Once the applicants are selected they will be presented to the board for approval. The recipients will be given their scholarship checks on Senior Appreciation Day at AHS on May 19th.

Diane commented "I was especially pleased that the Board voted to provide four scholarships instead of two to Arnold High School graduating seniors . As it was, we had 11 superior submissions, so the selection was daunting. It is because of you, our members, who always step up to do extra in our fundraising activities. Many of you go beyond the three required committee participations and take on extra work. For that, I sincerely thank you."
