## "A Successful Year for The Women's Civic Club!"

The Women's Civic Club of PCB is a working club and we certainly have proof of that this year. Each year a budget is prepared with the goal of raising funds to give back to the needs in our community and those budgeted funds are distributed at the December luncheon. The end of our fiscal year (April) is nearing and we have had such a successful fundraising year that we have additional funds to distribute. At the March luncheon meeting our membership approved to amend our 2023-2024 budget to include additional distributions in the amount of \$26,550! The recipients of these additional funds are:

Thank you for your continued support for the food pantry at Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church. Like all food pantries they service a large population of needy families and homeless on the beach. For the months of January, February and March 2024 the Presbyterian Church served 164 patrons that equates to 1,476 meals. At our May business luncheon we will again be collecting for the food pantry, both donated goods and cash.

As we go through the summer, please think about donating food, money or volunteer time to our church run food pantries. The following are their hours and the times to donate cash or drop off food.

Gulf Beach Baptist Church on Hutchinson: Tuesday thru Friday 9-12

Wood Lawn Church on Alf Coleman: Tuesday 1-3, Wednesday and Thursday 9:30-11:30

Gulf Beach Presbyterian on Hwy 79: Monday, Wednesday and Friday 9-12

If you specifically want to help with food for the homeless, the pantries give out fruits and vegetables in cans with pull off tabs, packages of peanut butter crackers, packaged cookies or energy bars, pre sliced bread and bottled water. Additional items needed for the homeless are hygienic products (small containers) and sun block.

Again, thanks to the generosity of our Club, other “community” organizations and businesses, our food pantries continue to meet the growing needs of the less fortunate families and individuals on the beach.




Dear Members and Friends Women's Civic Club,
