

A Testimony of How Donations Can a Difference

Hi, my name is Carly, and I am ten years old. I have been coming to Girls Inc. for over a year now. Just before I came to Girls Inc., my sisters and I were in foster care. It was a very tough time, but my mom tried her best to get us back - and she did! When my mom was trying to get us back, they cut back our visits to once a week. It was hard for me in foster care, because I missed our parents, but coming to Girls Inc, and making friends, made me think life isn't that bad. It was always tough not seeing my mom. It was even tougher being the oldest sister during that time, because I had to make sure the younger sisters were okay! Even though it was hard, being a sister is the most extraordinary thing, because it gives me the privilege of being a big sister. Coming here also has helped me move on from what has happened in our past. We found mentors at Girls Inc., which are the staff. With the help of staff, I have felt like I could take a step back, and not have to protect my sisters as much. The staff at Girls Inc., makes me feel safe.

I started Girls Inc., during summer camp. At first, I was shy and a little bit scared, but some of the other girls invited me to play foursquare and that made me feel welcomed. At summer camp, free lunch is always included for everyone who needs or even just wants one. This was important to me, because it showed they cared, and because no one goes home hungry.

After summer camp, we signed up for the afterschool program. The afterschool program helped my family because my mom was able to work so that we could have all the things we needed. The afterschool program helped me and my sisters with homework, which let us come home and spend time with my mom. After school we stayed at Girls Inc. until 5:30, and my mom was working hard to get us a new home. On February 18th, we moved into our first home, as a reunited family. The afterschool program was a great experience for me and my sisters because we were at Girls Inc., having fun, and life felt a lot brighter. Coming to Girls Inc. after school, and things changing at home, made life feel like it was full of color again.

Being at Girls Inc., I have made lots of nice memories, but my favorite memory is the feeling of being welcomed that first day. Girls Inc. is an incredible place, where we get to learn new things every day. At Girls Inc., we are inspired to try new activities and foods, during our fun programs. Some of my favorite programs are perler beads, crochet, weaving looms, and building obstacle courses. We also do a program over the summer, for 6th graders and older, called Step-Staff. Step-Staff gives us an opportunity to learn responsibility and leadership. We learn how to be caring, and helpful. Step-Staff members must go through an interview process and do an application. We have to sign in and out every day and keep track of our hours. At the end of the summer, we get to go to Shipwreck Water Park, if we complete our 50 hours. It's a lot of hard work, but it pays off, and it teaches us responsibility. What I loved most about the Step-Staff Programs was being Teachers Assistant and helping out the younger kids.

Over the last year, making friends and participating in programs, I have grown in many ways. I feel less attached to the things I have been through in the past. I have learned that it is okay that I will never forget, but I can now forgive. I really hope that Girls Inc. can help my younger sisters, like it has helped me. Girls Inc. has changed my life to be better and helped me to be stronger. A year ago, I probably wouldn't have come on stage to tell my story but Girls Inc. has helped me to encourage myself and do things I wouldn't do before. Thank you for listening to my story, I hope sharing this story helps others feel encouraged, too.
