COMMITTEE REPORTS

Scholarship:

The club has been very generous over the years in providing a scholarship to students at Gulf Coast State College and most recently Arnold High School. As far back as 2000-2001 the club has budgeted money for scholarships.

Prior to the scholarship /endowment to GCCC in 2007-2008, the board received applications from students attending GCCC and selected the recipients. Once the endowments were established at GCCC, the Foundation's Scholarship Committee handled the applications and selected the recipients.

A second scholarship /endowment was made to Gulf Coast State College for \$15,000 in 2013 for their Culinary students. In 2011-2012 we did not have mon-

ey budgeted for scholarships, but the club voted to donate \$1,000 to Arnold High School to help with the purchase of band uniforms for the new school. Beginning, in our calendar year, 2016- 2017, we have budgeted \$2,000 each year for two Scholarships for graduating seniors at Arnold High School.

For our \$1,000 scholarship recipients, the Scholarship Committee works with Arnold High School principal and counselors to identify two high school graduating seniors residing in Panama City Beach who will be attending an accredited college or vocation training, .

Graduating seniors can download our scholarship application online at www.wccpcb.org. Applications must be post marked no later than April 1st. Once all applications are received, the Scholarship Committee selects the recipients, who are then invited to one of our business/ luncheon meetings.


Member and Arts and Crafts Committees are doing. Thank you for the great work.
