"Foundations of the Club"

The November edition of The Civic Courier, "Foundations of the Club" is highlighting Judy Hardegree and focusing on one of our charities, The Boys and Girls Club.



Judy Hardegree

Judy Hardegree was born in Gadsden, Alabama where she lived until age 12, when her father accepted a position in Houston, Texas. She was very close to her grandparents who lived in Chattanooga, Tennessee and spent every summer with them beginning at age 5. When she moved to Texas, her grandfather would take the Chattanooga Choo-Choo train to Houston and take her back to Chattanooga for the entire summer. After graduating from high school in Houston, she married and returned to Chattanooga where she raised two sons.

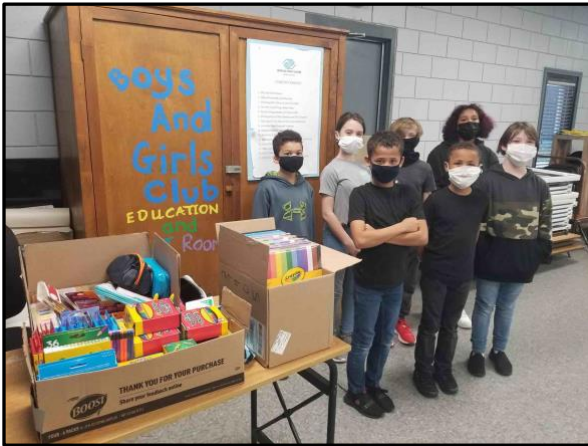
When her sons were in middle school, Judy took a position with a Fortune 500 insurance company. She took night classes for eight years at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga in pre-med courses needed in her job. Judy was promoted to Chief Underwriter in the Disability Section and worked for the company for thirty-six (36) years. During her career she was President of a women's club which was actively involved in fund-raising events for the benefit of St. Jude Children's Hospital in Memphis. She was also the President of her company's "Quarter Century Club" (about 200 employees with twenty-five years of service). Judy and her husband Tony, an engineer who worked at Tennessee Valley Authority for many years, moved to Panama City Beach one day after she retired in 2000.

In 2000 several neighborhood couples, herself, and local dignitaries were working to set up a homeless prevention charity and Beach Care Services was born. Judy served as a board member for many years and volunteered in the office for 20 years. Mildred Land, a neighbor, persuaded Judy to join the Women's Civic Club in February 2001. She has served as the Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Second Vice President, First Vice President, Chair of the Beach Care Services Committee, Yearbook Editor and Member to Member Committee Chair. As Member to Member Chair, she invited club members to her home and introduced them to bunco.

Judy said she is proud of all the club has accomplished during her twenty-two years as a member; citing the donation to the police department of two drug dogs, the donation for a dog training facility, the donation of the flags on the beach, and the establishment of the scholarship endowments at Gulf Coast College. She also enjoyed working the dance, silent auction, school projects. As a personal note, Judy and Tony enjoy their two sons, a daughter, five grandchildren and six greats who visit several times a year.

When asked if she has a word of wisdom for members, Judy said "When you join the club honor your promise to work because the things the club does will allow it to continue".

The Boys and Girls Club



Imagine a place where who you are, where you're from or the circumstances that surround you don't determine your access to experiences or opportunities. The Boys and Girls Club provides a world-class club experience that assures success is within reach of every young person who enters their doors. Their goal is to enable all young people, especially those who need it most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

Boys & Girls Clubs of America had its beginnings in 1860 with three women in Hartford, Connecticut - Mary Goodwin, Alice Goodwin and Elizabeth Hammersley. Believing that boys who roamed the streets should have a positive alternative, they organized the first Club. With character development as the

cornerstone of the experience, the Club focused on capturing boy's interests, improving their behavior and increasing their personal expectations and goals. A cause was born. To recognize the fact that girls are a part of their cause, the national organization's name was changed to Boys & Girls Clubs of America in 1990.

The Women's Civic Club supports the Boys and Girls Club of Panama City Beach with an annual donation which is used for swim lessons for the members. The club felt it was important for all kids to learn to swim so they can safely enjoy the beautiful beaches in our community. Craft items are also collected at one of the monthly luncheon meetings for the Boys and Girls Club Education and Craft Program. The Club liaison to the Boys and Girls Club is Cheri Leistner.

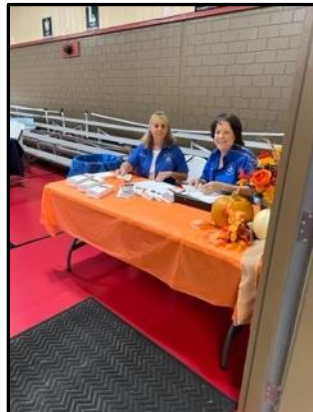
