

### **Community Outreach and Library**



### **Food Pantry**

**We at Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church seek to answer God's call to service in a variety of ways and feeding the hungry is a very important one.**

In the mid 1970's Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church had many requests for assistance. The Church decided to establish vouchers with a local restaurant and gas station to provide a hot meal and gasoline and bill the church. Many times, these

vouchers were not turned in to the church but considered a donation. At this time the Session decided to start a Pastor's Fund. Also, at this time they granted use of the church facilities to the Bay County Council on Aging for a congregate site for a food distribution program "Meals on Wheels". After this program was discontinued in the mid 1980's, the Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church decided to start its own Food Pantry to help the needy in the community.

By 1991, under the guidance of Rev. Dr. Ken Churchill, the food pantry was expanded and established regular hours of Monday – Friday 9am – 12 noon and was staffed by church volunteers. At that time a local business closed and offered to donate shelves so we converted a Sunday School room into a Food Bank. We also opened a Clothes Closet stocked with donated men's, women's and children's clothes, including baby items. Soon we realized the need was mostly work clothes, jeans and work shoes. We established a "work boot voucher" account at Kmart. That first year we gave out hundreds of vouchers for work shoes and gas and gave thousands of meals thru the food Pantry.

The Presbytery of Florida gave us a \$5100.00 grant to help support the mission. We also received corporate donations from 3M and Bell South. The companies matched donations of time or money given by current or retired employees. We also were supported by many churches and agencies including Catholic Charities, Grace Episcopal Church, Salvation Army and many others.

In 1998, the coalition of agencies, Catholic Charities, Salvation Army and others wanted to establish a presence on the beach and we entered into a 9-month contract for the corporative venture to provide additional services on the beach. We provided three rooms in the church to be used as an office for referrals and the two rooms of food and clothing distribution. From this group, we formed a board of directors and established Beach Care Services.

We applied for and qualified for Federal Government Surplus Food. In the year 2000, we became the distribution center for our area.

In 2000, Rev. Churchill and the mission committee chair were invited to speak about the Food Pantry on Gulf Coast Community College Talk Radio. This invitation resulted in many great News Herald articles.

It is an ecumenical endeavor that is supported by many area churches and local community groups making it possible to continue the mission of meeting the needs of the community's less fortunate without interruption, even during COVID and hurricanes. The Pantry is open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9-12:00. We offer 3-day emergency food assistance to individuals and families in need.

Statistics: 2025 per month served 616 people, 5544 meals.

The food pantry is always looking for more volunteers. To volunteer, contact the church office at (850) 234-3161.
