# "Foundations of the Club"

In this edition of The Civic Courier, "Foundations of the Club" is highlighting Gwen Odenheimer and focusing on Committees and Duties.



Gwen Odenheimer became a member of the Women's Civic Club in January 1983. She was invited by Betty Boyd, who was the President in 1982-1984, to join the club. Being a take charge type of person, Gwen was selected as the President in 1985-1987.

Originally from East Brunswick, New Jersey she married her husband, a World War II serviceman, in Troy, Alabama in 1948 at the age of 18. Under the GI bill, her husband was attending Troy State Teacher College and she was helping him with his studies. With her determination and persistence, she was able to obtain a scholarship to attend college also and they both received degrees in Health and Physical Education. After graduation, they returned to New Jersey to teach school until they retired in 1982.

Gwen started the Arts and Craft Committee and taught many members quilting, knitting, leaded glass and other crafts in her home located in the Holiday Golf Club. She shared how the club would sell sweatshirts at a local yearly fair for which the club received \$2 for each sweatshirt sold. The fair was cancelled when a hurricane struck the area. Since the sweatshirts had been purchased, being creative the members sold them in front of stores.

In 2018, when she was displaced because of Hurricane Michael she moved near her son in Tallahassee. Although she will be 92 in October, she still drives, is active in 3 different senior centers, plays cards 5 days a week and watches golf. When asked if she had a word of wisdom to share with club members, she said "Keep going". She was also appreciative of the scholarship she received when she was young, and she knows the importance of scholarships.

#### **Committees and Duties:**

Committees plan fund raising opportunities, develop outreach activities, educate members and provide awareness of the club in the community and are an essential part of the Women's Civic Club in achieving our mission and goals. There are three types of committees: Funding-Raising, Community Outreach and Events, and Appointed. Each member will complete a committee sign up form each year and is required to select at least one (1) fund-raising committee and at least two (2) community outreach and event committees; but are not limited to the number of committees they may serve on.
