Hearty Sauerkraut Casserole

1 pound mild Italian sausage links (cut into 1-inch pieces)

1 large onion, chopped

2 apples—peeled and quartered

27-oz. can or jar of sauerkraut—undrained

1 cup water

1/2 cup brown sugar, packed

2 tsps. Caraway seeds

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Brown sausage and onion in skillet or Dutch oven. Drain fat. Stir in remaining ingredients. Transfer to a 2 1/2-quart baking dish. Cover and bake one hour. Serves 4 as a main dish. It is also great on a bun for tailgating.
